Discuss with Learners the contributions of Dr. Kwame Nkrumah to the growth of CPP. in June 1949 the new Convention Peoples' Party (CPP), a mass-based party that was committed to a program of immediate self-government. In January 1950, Nkrumah initiated a campaign of "positive action," involving nonviolent protests, strikes, and noncooperation with the British colonial authorities. Kwame Nkrumah, had established the Convention People's Party (CPP), which, with wide popular support, campaigned with strikes and other actions under the slogan "Self-government now." In 1951 the CPP won almost all the elective seats in the post-Coussey legislative assembly, whereupon Gov. Sir Charles Arden-Clarke invited Nkrumah to lead the Party 	Core Competencies; 1.
