Different cultures have different definitions of how close a relative would be considered taboo. • Infanticide - killing an infant • Wearing shoes inside - in some places, shoes are not worn inside a house <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. sexual intercourse with someone other than your spouse. 2.
