| <p>THURSDAY</p> <p>25-05-2023</p> | <p>Learners brainstorm to identify 5 Proverbs and wise sayings.</p> | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Assist learners to identify moral lessons from proverbs and wise sayings. 2. Discuss the meaning of "Taboos" with the Learners. 3. Learners in small groups to discuss and report to the class about moral lessons from taboos. <p>Meaning of Proverbs</p> <p>A proverb is basically just an expression or saying based on common sense or experience. They are nothing but common and traditional sayings which explain some truth. They are often metaphorical in nature.</p> <p>Examples of Proverbs and their meanings;</p> <p>1) <i>Birds of the same feather flock together</i> – people with common characteristics always end up together.</p> <p>2) <i>He who plays the piper calls the tune</i> – when one has to act according to a superior's wishes.</p> <p>3) <i>Out of sight, out of mind</i> – once you lose sight of a thing, you can forget it altogether.</p> <p>4) <i>Beggars can't be choosers</i> – when a person is in a difficult position, he can only take whatever he gets.</p> <p>5) <i>All is well that ends well</i> – everything is acceptable as long as the ending is favourable.</p> | <p>Through questions and answers, conclude the lesson.</p> <p>Exercise;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.State 5 examples of African Proverbs. 2. Explain 3 moral lessons from Proverbs and wise sayings. 3. What is a Taboo? 4. State 2 moral lessons from taboos. |

6) ***Two heads are better than one*** – two people can do a better job together than one person doing it alone.

7) ***Look before you leap*** – always be cautious before doing something big or important.

8) ***Robbing Peter to save Paul*** – when somebody harms one person to cause some benefit to another.

9) ***Make hay when the sun shines*** – making full use of a given opportunity.

10) ***Out of the frying pan and into the fire*** – entering one difficult situation from another.

Taboo

A taboo, also spelled tabu, is a social group's ban, prohibition, or avoidance of something based on the group's sense that it is excessively repulsive, offensive, sacred, or allowed only for certain persons. Such prohibitions are present in virtually all societies.
