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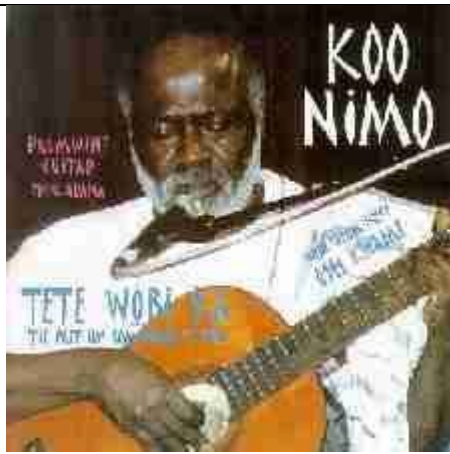

Contributions of Agya Koo Nimo to the Ghanaian society;

		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In 1957, he formed the Ghanaian roots ensemble, Adadam Agofomma, which received huge commendation. 2. He became the first Ghanaian to have his work put on a compact disk in 1990 when his eight-song album Osabarima was released. 3. In 1998, he was employed as a Professor of Ethnomusicology at the University of Washington in Seattle, USA, for two years, before taking a similar position at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. 4. In 1985, he was appointed interim chairman of COSGA, the Copyright Society of Ghana. More recently, he has been made an honorary life member of the International Association for the Study of Popular Music, along with such distinguished names as Professors J. H. K. Nketia and John Collins. <p>Contributions of Kojo Antwi to the Ghanaian Economy;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Kojo Antwi appears to have, to a large extent, focused on educating and entertaining his fans, especially the youth and adults on issues of marriage and love. 2. Kojo Antwi has been one of the towering figures on the Ghanaian music scene for nearly three and half decades. He has been called Mr Music Man, the King of Hearts, and has won several prestigious national and international awards. Most of the artists in Ghana sing about various social, economic and political issues.
