They present evidence about the world in a simple, optical way. They inform us about the world by showing the sizes and shapes of countries, locations, and distances between places. A sketch map is a rough drawing of an area. It is drawn without scale. They are simple drawings of the landscape. They show things that are hidden in photographs or maps. These maps are drawn from the same viewpoint as a vertical aerial photograph.
