Discuss the differences between the various themes and techniques of visual art. <p>What is Theme in Art?</p> <p>The definition of theme in art is the message that the artist wishes to convey through the artwork. Theme is not simply the subject matter of the piece of art; rather, it is the abstract idea being portrayed by both the artist's design and the subject matter that is created. Though the theme is separate from the subject matter, the subject matter, how it is arranged, and the colors used to represent the subject matter can all be used to convey a message or idea. Themes are often important messages about human life, emotions, and human nature. Themes</p>	Learners in small groups to discuss and identify the similarities between the themes and techniques of visual arts.


