Prepositions and postpositions

Prepositions: preposition – noun. English:
 count for me
 prep noun

Postpositions: noun – postposition. Witsuwit'en:
 [s- pe c'oOt*w]
 me for you (sg.) count
 noun postposition
 'count for me'

Examples of Prepositions;

In, on, at, through, across, above, over, up, down, to, with, by, beside, beneath, in front of, between, among.

Postpositions;

For example, in the sentence "I went to the store two days ago," the word "ago" is a postposition that is used to indicate the phrase "two days" as the timeframe for the action in the sentence.

Prepositions and postpositions are words that precede or follow *noun phrases* (e.g. nouns or pronouns), and form *adverbials* with them. Prepositions come before noun phrases, and postpositions come after them. An example of a preposition is *gaskkal*, "between", and an example of a postposition is *haga*, "without". There are many words that can function both as prepositions and postpositions, consider the word *birra*, 'about' or "around". The phrase that the preposition or postposition stands next to is in the *genitive* form

Through questions and answers, conclude the lesson.

If you wish to describe your life in greater depth, you might look at how to write an autobiography. A literacy narrative essay explores the writer's experiences with literacy and how it has influenced their life. The essay typically tells a personal story about a significant moment or series of moments that impacted the writer's relationship with reading, writing, or communication.
