What is WORK? A - The Meaning of Work 1 - Work - is done on an object when the object moves in the SAME direction in which the force is exerted. Example: Pushing a child on a swing, pulling books out of your backpack 2 - No motion = NO WORK a) If the object does not move, there is no work being done even if you exert a force!
