		<p><b>Outcome of the 1956 election;</b> General elections were held in the Gold Coast (soon to become Ghana) on 17 July 1956. The result was a victory for Kwame Nkrumah's Convention People's Party, which won 71 of the 104 seats.</p>

Learners brainstorm to mention the number of seats won by the CPP Party.</li></ol> <p><b>What happened during the 1956 election;</b> It was held on Tuesday, November 6, 1956. President Dwight D. Eisenhower successfully ran for reelection against Adlai Stevenson II, the former Illinois governor whom he had defeated four years earlier.
