






Shading Techniques

Pattern Making;

Pattern in art is made by repeating or echoing the visual elements of an artwork. The Visual Element of Pattern is constructed by repeating or echoing the elements of an artwork to communicate a sense of balance, harmony, contrast, rhythm or movement.

Techniques and Media for Pattern Making;

- Dabbing
- direct Printing
- relief printing



Dabbing;

Dabbing – The 'dabbing' technique is just as it sounds: you dab paint onto the surface using the corner of a sponge or a piece of paper towel. Dabbing adds texture and movement to a piece. For instance, you can use the dabbing technique to create treetops that appear as though they are swaying in the breeze.





Direct Printing:

A process wherein the colors for the desired designs are applied directly to the white or dyed cloth, as distinguished from discharge printing and resist printing.
