They present evidence about the world in a simple, optical way. They inform us about the world by showing the sizes and shapes of countries, locations, and distances between places.</div> <div>A sketch map is a rough drawing of an area. It is drawn without scale.</div> <div>- They are simple drawings of the landscape. They show things that are hidden in photographs or maps.</div> <div>- These maps are drawn from the same viewpoint as a vertical aerial photograph. They usually show the main characteristics of an area and are not cluttered with unnecessary detail.</div> <div>- Sketch maps are free hand maps drawn on blackboard to present geographic ideas and facts clearly and forcefully.</div> <div>- Sketch mapping reduces unrelated detail and maximizes crucial geographic points. It is used to display and know the relative humidity, density, gradients, and spatial relationships between areas or movements. 3.
