


10 The proverbs of Solomon:

A wise son brings joy to his father, but a foolish son brings grief to his mother.

- ² Ill-gotten treasures have no lasting value, but righteousness delivers from death.
- ³The LORD does not let the righteous go hungry, but he thwarts the craving of the wicked.
- ⁴Lazy hands make for poverty, but diligent hands bring wealth.
- ⁵ He who gathers crops in summer is a prudent son, but he who sleeps during harvest is a disgraceful son.
- **11** The LORD detests dishonest scales, but accurate weights find favor with him.
- ² When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with humility comes wisdom.
- ³ The integrity of the upright guides them, but the unfaithful are destroyed by their duplicity.
- ⁴Wealth is worthless in the day of wrath, but righteousness delivers from death.
- ⁵ The righteousness of the blameless makes their paths straight,

but the wicked are brought down by their own
