

		<p>Importance of Maps</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Maps are an important part of history. Maps show us things like where people have lived and moved, the weather of different continents and regions, and other changes in that take place in the world.</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Maps represent the real world on a much smaller scale.</li> <li>✓ They help you travel from one location to another.</li> <li>✓ They help you organize information.</li> <li>✓ They help you figure out where you are and how to get where you want to go.</li> </ul>

Assist learners to locate some important landmarks in their community using maps.</li> </ol> <p><b>Parts of a Map</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Title.</li> <li>• Scale.</li> <li>• Legend.</li> <li>• Compass.</li> <li>• Latitude and Longitude.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Components of a Map</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b><u>Title</u></b> – what the map is about</li> <li>2. <b><u>Compass Rose</u></b> – directions  (orientation of map)</li> <li>3. <b><u>Symbols</u></b> – pictures used instead of words</li> <li>4. <b><u>Legend or Key</u></b> – explains meaning of symbols and colour</li> <li>5. <b><u>Colour</u></b> – highlights important or different information to help interpret maps</li> <li>6. <b><u>Scale</u></b> – shows the proportion of map to real life</li> <li>7. <b><u>Grid reference</u></b> – intersecting lines to help locate specific places on the map. Ex. E8</li> </ol> <p><b>These eight possible map elements that make up the parts of a map are:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• data (or map) frame.</li> <li>• map legend.</li> <li>• map title.</li> <li>• north arrow.</li> </ul>	<p>Through questions and answers, conclude the lesson.</p> <p><b>Exercise;</b></p> <p>Explain 4 components of Map.</p>
