

Learners in small groups to explain how the causal factors of deforestation and desertification Desertification; Desertification is the process by which vegetation in drylands i.e. arid and semi-arid lands, such as grasslands or shrublands, decreases and eventually disappears. Deforestation; Deforestation refers to the decrease in forest areas across the world that are lost for other uses such as agricultural croplands, urbanization, or mining activities. Causes of Deforestation; Direct causes of deforestation are agricultural expansion wood extraction (e.g., logging or wood harvest for domestic fuel or charcoal) infrastructure expansion such as road building and urbanization.
