Learners to role play how puberty rites are performed in their community. Activities Performed during Bragoro; ✓ The first activity of the day is enstoolment which is performed by an old woman who has many children ✓ The initiate is placed on a stool three times remaining on the stool the third time. ✓ The stool is usually placed on a mat covered with a blanket or kente cloth. ✓ A brass basin called Yaawa is filled with water containing Adwera or Odwen-Ahaban (leaves of Odwen) with an egg and a dry okro fruit is placed beside the girl. ✓ According to Nana Gyamfua, the Obaapanyin or Queen mother of Woarakose, a woman sits beside the Yaawa and when gifts in the form of coins are put in the Yaawa, she sprinkles water with the adwera or odwen on the girl. "the sprinkling of this water will protect her from evil spirits that may make her barren. Women sing and move around the girl". Activities performed during Dipo; 				Reflect on activities performed during Puberty rite in Learners Community. Exercise; 1. Describe how Dipo is performed. 2. Describe how Bragoro is performed.	

		 ✓ On the first day of the rites, the girls have their heads shaved and dressed with cloth around their waist to just their knee level. This is done by a special ritual mother and it signifies their transition from childhood to adulthood. ✓ They are paraded to the entire community as the initiates (dipo-yo). ✓ They are taught the Klama dance, undergo a ritual bath and the crux of the rite is when the girls are made to sit on a stone which is believed determines virginity ✓ Any girl who is found not to be a virgin at the time of the rites used to be ostracized in the past and was treated as an outcast.
