Invite a resource person in the community to talk about any of the systems of inheritance Family Systems in Ghana; Matrilineal Patrilineal Intestate succession. A matriline is a line of descent from a female ancestor to a descendant (of either sex) in which the individuals in all intervening generations are mothers — in other words, a "mother line". In a matrilineal descent system, an individual is considered to belong to the same descent group as their mother. In patrilineal communities land is inherited through the male lineage and property passes directly to sons. Women have secondary rights as they can have access to it through their husbands and sons. Upon death of the husband, the woman can use the land that her husband owned as long as she is unmarried.
